



**Steve Fuller** (born 1959, New York City) is Professor of Sociology at the University of Warwick, UK. He received his B.A. *summa cum laude* (History & Sociology) from Columbia University (1979), M.Phil. (History & Philosophy of Science) from Cambridge University (1981), and Ph.D. (History & Philosophy of Science) from University of Pittsburgh (1985). He is the founder of the research program of social epistemology. It is the name of a quarterly journal he founded with Taylor & Francis in 1987, as well as the first of his many books: *Social Epistemology* (Indiana University Press, 1988 [2nd edn. 2002]), *Philosophy of Science and Its Discontents*, Guilford Press, 1989 [2nd edn. 1993]), *Philosophy, Rhetoric and the End of Knowledge* (Lawrence Erlbaum Associates, 1993 [2nd edn. 2003]), *Science* (Open University Press and University of Minnesota Press, 1997; translated into Japanese, 2000), *The Governance of Science* (Open University Press, 2000), *Thomas Kuhn: A Philosophical History for Our Times* (University of Chicago Press, 2000), *Knowledge Management Foundations* (Butterworth-Heinemann, 2002), *Kuhn vs Popper: The Struggle for the Soul of Science* (Icon and Columbia University Press, 2003), *The Intellectual* (Icon, 2005); *The Philosophy of Science and Technology Studies* (Routledge, 2006), *The New Sociological Imagination* (Sage, 2006), *The Knowledge Book* (Acumen and McGill-Queens University Press, 2007), *New Frontiers in Science & Technology Studies* (Polity, 2007), *Science vs. Religion?* (Polity, 2007). Fuller is also the author of over 200 articles and has given 500 public talks in 25 countries. His work has appeared in fifteen languages. Fuller is a Fellow of the Royal Society for the Arts and is listed in *Who's Who in the World*. In 2007, Warwick University awarded him a 'higher doctorate' (D.Litt.) for distinguished contributions to scholarship. He is President-Elect for the Sociology and Social Policy Section of the British Association for the Advancement of Science.
